January 2023 Sales Tax Check

The City saw an increase in sales tax revenue with January's sales tax revenue total of \$4,643,575.69.

The City of Odessa received its January sales tax check, in the amount of, \$5,804,469.61. This amount includes the Economic Development sales tax of ¹/₄ cent. The City of Odessa will receive \$4,643,575.69 and the Odessa Development Corporation will receive \$1,160,893.92.

The City saw an increase in sales tax revenue with January's sales tax revenue total of \$4,643,575.69 which reflects a \$987,327.09, or 27.00% increase as compared to January 2022.

The year-to-date total sales tax revenue for fiscal year 2022-23 is up 33.82%, or \$4,651,277.87 as compared to budgeted amount expected at this point in the fiscal year.

In addition, the 2022-23 year-to-date amount is above the previous fiscal year-to-date amount by \$3,246,727.49 or 21.42%.

The City has budgeted \$44,000,000.00 in net sales tax revenues for this current fiscal year.

Sales tax revenue is generated by sales tax revenue from two months prior to collection, i.e., January's collection is based on November sales.

Defending the Lone Star State

Freedom lives in the Lone Star State!

It lived in the spirit of those who bravely defended the Alamo in 1836 and it lives today in the hearts of those who continue making our state the greatest in the Union: the mothers and fathers working to provide for their families, the first responders keeping us safe, the teachers educating our future generations, and the men and women of the Permian Basin tirelessly working in the energy industry to sustain the American Dream.

As your state representative I take seriously my role to serve not only as a voice for West Texans but also as a fierce defender of the liberty we cherish in Texas.

Since President Biden took office, his administration has embraced open-border policies, which has resulted in the crisis we are seeing along our southern border. The Biden Administration has repeatedly refused to do its job to secure the border. However, Texas has and will continue to step up to secure the border.

Just a few days ago Governor Greg Abbott appointed Mike Banks – a former Border Patrol agent with decades of experience in federal law enforcement and border security operations – to serve as the State of Texas' first-ever Border Czar. Texas Border Czar Banks will report directly to the governor as a special advisor and will ensure border security strategies are fully executed in Texas in the absence of meaningful federal action. He will collaborate daily with the Texas Military Department, DPS, and other state agencies, local officials, and Texas landowners to carry out Operation Lone Star's mission.

Texas is not the place for weak borders or illegal crossings and we will not stand idle, waiting for the Biden Administration to do its job. With the 2023 legislative session underway, I will continue fighting and advocating for Texas to do everything we can under the Constitution to secure the border.

My fight to defend Texas will not stop and those who wish to mess with our freedom will have to come and take it! As always, I am fiercely committed to representing the hard working people of the Permian Basin and I'm honored to serve as your voice in the Texas House. Hello, from Austin!

Session is officially underway in the Capitol building, and we have hit the ground running. This past month has been a whirlwind of events: Jill and I made the move to Austin, I was sworn in to office, I drew a four year term, and I had my first grandchild -- that was all in one week! Along with these milestones, I finally received my Senate committee assignments. I am humbled and honored to have been placed on the following committees:

- Health & Human Services
- Natural Resources & Economic Development
- Veteran Affairs
- Water, Agriculture, and Rural Affairs
- Nominations as Vice-Chairman

I am certain these committee assignments align not only with my experience and interests, but with the interests of our district as well. Below, I want to briefly address my plans for each committee and how I will use my position to best serve Senate District 31 and the state of Texas.

Health & Human Services

There are an array of issues needed to be addressed in this committee; however, I will focus specifically on two that are prevalent in our district: mental health and foster care. Mental health constitutes a growing issue across our state, especially in our district. After many conversations with your local officials, it has become very clear to me that new facilities in the district are necessary. The Lieutenant Governor has publicly committed to mental health resources in the panhandle and I am working with your state representatives on how to allocate these resources to best serve the area.

Foster care has been a significant issue near to my heart for a while. Having served on boards for community-based foster care organizations, I understand the importance of providing quality foster care. Our current foster care system is inefficient, unsafe, and does not produce the best possible outcomes for the young Texans who rely on the various programs. I will take a deep dive into this issue and find ways to properly care for our children.

Natural Resources & Economic Development

Our district fuels our state, our nation, and our planet. The natural resources found in our part of the world are the reason Texas boasts the 9th largest economy on the planet. As you may know, our livelihood of extracting and producing fossil fuels for the rest of the world is under attack. Some individuals ignorantly attack the oil and gas industry without realizing its importance. Serving on this committee will allow me to defend and preserve the resource that help make our state so great. As the only Senator with direct oil and gas experience, I will be able to bring a new point of view to this committee that will help prevent any uneducated and unnecessary policy from being written that would negatively affect the use of our resources.

Veteran Affairs

This issue needs no explanation. Our veterans deserve the utmost care, attention, and honor. It baffles me that our government values the individuals entering our county illegally over our military servicemen who laid their life on the line to protect our freedoms. Listening to members of the military community will provide the real story those in government do not completely illustrate. Water, Agriculture, and Rural Affairs

Senate District 31 is likely the most rural district in the state. It is only appropriate that this committee assignment was given to us as the decisions made here will directly affect District 31. Most legislators represent urban and suburban neighborhoods, therefore we have to make sure that our voices are heard loud and clear.

With water (or lack there of) and agriculture being so vital to our district's way of life, I plan to serve as a fierce advocate for their protection and preservation. Similar to the oil and gas industry, the rest of the country heavily depends on our agriculture and ranching industries. In SD 31, we feed and clothe more people than any other district in the state. They continue to face intense pressure from extremist environmental groups as well as government agencies driven by extremist activism. Outside forces either don't understand, or don't care, that our hardworking farmers and ranchers are literally putting food on their tables and clothes on their backs. I intend to defend these folks and ensure Texas remains a place for them to continue to conduct their business freely.

Nominations

I am honored to have the Vice Chairman position on the Nominations committee. This committee is vital to protecting the checks and balances of our state government by ensuring that we place competent individuals in powerful positions. I plan to approach my position on this committee with the interest of our state's long-term well-being in mind. We must ensure that the right people have a place in government to provide every opportunity for the future of Texas.

I am excited for the opportunity to represent you on these committees in the coming weeks and months. It is through my time in these meetings, that I will truly have the agency to fight for the issues you elected me to address. Best Sugar Cookie Recipe

Soft cut out sugar cookie recipe that keeps its shape and dough does not need to be chilled before baking- perfect edges every time!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 Cup unsalted butter 226 grams
- 1 Cup granulated white sugar 200 grams
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- 1 egg
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 cups all purpose flour 360 grams

INSTRUCTIONS

1. PREHEAT oven to 350° F.





- 2. In the bowl of your mixer, CREAM butter and sugar until smooth, at least 3 minutes
- 3. BEAT in extracts and egg. (PLEASE NOTE there is 1 egg in this recipe.)

4. In a separate bowl, COMBINE baking powder and salt with flour and add a little at a time to the wet ingredients.

5. IMPORTANT NOTE: If the dough looks crumbly keep mixing for 30 seconds to 1 minute longer. The dough should be pulling away from the sides of the mixer.

6. If the dough still looks too dry or stiff for your mixer, turn out the dough onto a countertop surface, flour surface as needed. Wet your hands and finish off kneading the dough by hand.

7. DO NOT CHILL THE DOUGH. Divide into workable batches (2-3 chunks), roll out onto a floured surface, and cut. You want these cookies to be on the thicker side (closer to 1/4 inch rather than 1/8).

8. Bake at 350 for 6-8 minutes. Let cool on the cookie sheet until firm enough to transfer to a cooling rac

February 10, 2023

President Joe Biden delivered his State of the Union address this week, where he made false claims about Republicans and the state of our economy and security.

The truth is that his policies have driven our country into an economic and national security crisis.

We are paying substantially more in 2023 for the same goods and services we bought in 2021. When President Biden took office, inflation was at just 1.4%. It spiked to 13% under his watch. Millions of illegal migrants have crossed our southern border along with an unknown number of drugs, terrorists, and weapons. December set a new record high for migration, with monthly encounters exceeding 250,000. Meanwhile, our biggest adversary, China, is emboldened by this administration's foreign policy failures and continues to test America's resolve, as seen with the recent spy balloon incursion into U.S. airspace.

One point the President and I agree on is that oil and gas WILL be essential for years to come. The difference is that Republicans have laid the groundwork to improve our energy infrastructure and prioritize energy security.

My hope is that the President will correct course and work with the legislative agenda that House Republicans are proposing to restore American energy dominance, bring down inflation, secure the border, and make our government accountable again.

Chinese Spy Balloon

The Biden Administration's failure to protect the U.S. mainland from a Chinese spy balloon is an example of how the President's foreign policy weaknesses and inability to deter aggression threaten our National Security.

It is imperative that we return to American strength. We must put an end to Chinese spying on Americans–whether in our airspace or on our children through their phones.

I am proud to be an Airman and to have served in the U.S. Air Force as an F-22 pilot — the very same jet that was used to bring down the Chinese surveillance balloon.

Biden's decision to allow an adversary aircraft to fly over sovereign American airspace was the single largest strategic failure in airpower's 100-year-plus history. Make no mistake, this wasn't a failure of the airmen flying, of technology, tactics, or capability. It was a failure of political will — exposing the weakness of Biden and his administration.

Blocking Noncitizens from Voting in DC

Last fall, the radical D.C. City Council passed a bill to give illegal immigrants, Chinese and Russian agents, foreign exchange students, and quite literally anyone who finds themselves in our Nation's capital for longer than 30 days the ability to vote in local elections.

Allowing noncitizens to vote in local elections is an extreme risk to the security of our election system. I was the <u>first Member of Congress to introduce legislation to block this ludicrous provision.</u>

Congress has a limited time to REVERSE the D.C. City Council decision, and this week we passed a bill to overturn the measure. This should not be a partisan issue, but unfortunately 162 Democrats sided with noncitizen voting!

Americans deserve confidence in our election system and confidence in knowing that ONLY LEGAL American citizens are casting their vote in elections here in this country.
