On September 11, 2021, I was a student at Texas A&M. That day was one enveloped by darkness – hijacked planes struck the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center to the ground and nearly 3,000 innocent Americans perished. But when the nation was in peril, Americans answered the call.

Not long after the attack, firefighters, police, and EMS ran into the fire and smoke without any regard to fear – risking their lives to save others. Days later, thousands of brave men and women, including many West Texans, enlisted in the armed forces to take the fight overseas. The unimaginable acts of terrorism sought to bring down a country, but in the face of evil America rose from the ashes and 21 years later she stands strong in defiance.

We must never forget. Like President Ronald Reagan, I too believe that all great change begins at the dinner table. 
America is poised to be a light to the world in economic opportunity and freedom for many decades to come.



I will vote based as close as I can on God's Word (2 Timothy 3:16)











Constitution Day (or Citizenship Day), is

ECTOR COUNTY REPUBLICAN WOMEN INVOLVED IN NOVEMBER 8TH ELECTIONS

We are being a politically active group of Republican Women this election year. A group of our ladies' block walked in August for the Abbott campaign. Some of our members have been active in the Voter Engagement Program (VEP) by working the Red Dialer phone banking. Our club will have opportunity to do more of the phone banking in October as this is a crucial election to Keep Texas Red.

Voter Registration is a key point in winning elections. ECRW is doing our part with our members attending Voter Registrar's class right before the Permian Basin Fair week. At our booth one of the primary goals was to register voters, and we register around 30 voters. We have till October 11th to continue registration of voters.

The first day of Early Voting is September 24th and runs through October 4th. Early Voting takes place at five locations. Ector County Annex, Kellus Turner Community Center, MCM Elegante Hotel, The Globe Theater and Salinas Community Center. All these locations are open 7am to 7pm during early voting,

Locally we have a city council election on the ballot with only one position District 5 being contested. *Shaye Lane and Chris Hanie* are candidates for the Place 5 position. Both are working to get the voters out and will be part of our October 19th meeting. Place 4 has *Greg Connell* is unopposed as well as the Place 3 candidate is democrat *Gilbert Vasquez*. *Billy Hall* is the Republican candidate on the November 8th ballot for Precinct 4 Commissioner against a Democrat opponent.

State candidates are traveling throughout the state campaigning and asking for our votes. Attorney General Ken Paxton was the guest speaker at the Sept 6th of the High Plains Republican Women in Amarillo. The Midland Republican Women are having Lt Governor Dan Patrick as their September 15th speaker. Our club is having HD 74 candidate, Katherine Parker of Alpine as our October speaker, so candidates are making the rounds.

Creamy Tortellini Soup

Ingredients

- 1 lb Italian sausage browned and drained
- 1 small white onion diced
- 16 oz cheese tortellini
- 5 oz fresh spinach
- 2 14.5 oz cans of Italian style diced tomatoes drained (blend on of the cans)
- 8 oz cream cheese softened and cut into chunks
- 3 cups chicken broth
- ¼ cup of heavy whipping cream
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon coarse black pepper
- Salt to taste
- Italian blend shredded cheese for garnish

- 2. Put all ingredients in the slow cooker on low heat.
- 3. Cook on low for 4-6 hours, stirring occasionally if possible.

September Sales Tax Check

The City saw an increase in sales tax revenue with September's sales tax revenue total of \$4,342,345.33 which reflects a \$746,354.53, or 20.76% as compared to September 2021.

The City of Odessa received its September sales tax check, in the amount of, \$5,427,931.66. This amount includes the Economic Development sales tax of ¼ cent. The City of Odessa will receive \$4,342,345.33 and the Odessa Development Corporation will receive \$1,085,586.33.

The City saw an increase in sales tax revenue with September's sales tax revenue total of \$4,342,345.33 which reflects a \$746,354.53, or 20.76% as compared to September 2021.

The year-to-date total sales tax revenue for fiscal year 2021-22 is up 29.32%, or \$10,993,588.69 as compared to budgeted amount expected at this point in the fiscal year.

In addition, the 2021-22 year-to-date amount is above the previous fiscal year-to-date amount by \$7,134,670.71 or 17.25%.

The City has budgeted \$37,500,000.00 in net sales tax revenues for this current fiscal year.

Hear ye, hear ye

Sales tax revenue is generated by sales tax revenue from two months prior to collection, i.e., September's collection is based on July sales.

Announcing the BUS Act

Condemning Antisemitism

This week, the Foreign Affairs Committee considered H.R. 2374, the Peace and Tolerance in Palestinian Education Act. The bill notes that school-aged children in the West Bank and Gaza are learning from American taxpayer-funded textbooks containing materials that delegitimize Israel, denigrate Jews, and support martyrdom. It's alarming to learn that our taxpayer dollars are unknowingly promoting this hateful propaganda.

It's shocking enough that American taxpayer dollars are buying these textbooks, but I also used the opportunity to put lawmakers on record of where they stand on antisemitism. <u>I introduced an amendment making it crystal clear that antisemitism, xenophobia, and claims that Israel is an apartheid state are unacceptable.</u>

One of the members of the committee, **Rep. Ilhan Omar**, **refused to vote on my amendment**. This is no surprise, given that she repeatedly makes statements accusing Israel of being an apartheid state and claims Israel has "hypnotized the world." Her hateful rhetoric about the Jewish people and Israel has NO place in Congress, and her refusal to denounce antisemitism is telling.

Committed to Homeland Security

This week, Homeland Security Democrats hosted our final committee markup of this Congress on a climate change bill. This means that in two years, the committee charged with the security of our nation did not hold a SINGLE hearing on border security. Completely unacceptable.

I introduced an amendment to their ridiculous climate change bill to review the REAL environmental impacts of illegal immigration... mounds of trash, dead bodies, destroyed farmland, houses burned to the ground, and the enormous amount of money state and local governments have spent cleaning this up and keeping us safe.
